The course allows you to develop your own strengths by giving you a choice of assessment standards based on the shared contexts. This is a demanding course which requires a lot of self-management skills. You are expected to see at least two live performances and critique them throughout the year. You will also be expected to produce written assessments including research assignments, reviews, and essays. *you are expected to attend two live performances throughout the year.
