

Year 13 Expectations

Year 13 students:

- Must attend all timetabled classes and all Tūhono times. (the exception being Monday or Friday morning Tūhono, where they have a study period 1, students will get marked as on study).
- Can leave school during interval, lunchtimes and study periods but must sign out at the office
- Students must manage their time well to ensure they are on time to all timetabled classes.
- Whenever a student leaves the College grounds during school times they are still subject to normal school rules and expectations.
- Students with vehicles can park these in the carparks at the front of the school or by the gymnasium. Students must drive to the conditions of their licence (e.g. no passengers on restricted licence).

Year 13 Dress Code 2021

PURPOSE

This policy acknowledges that the clothes people choose to wear are an expression of their own identity.

Students, however, are expected to dress in a manner suitable for an educational environment.

Furthermore, we look to our Year 13 students as being role models, who set the tone for the younger students.

GUIDELINES

- A suitable standard of dress is one that is smart but not necessarily formal.
- Clothing should be clean and in good condition (not ripped or torn).
- Tops must be long enough to cover the top of shorts/pants/skirts.
- Low riding shorts, trousers, skirts and low cut tops are not acceptable. (Underwear should not be visible).
- Shorts and skirts should be at least mid-thigh in length. This applies to all students.
- Bare feet are unacceptable. Shoes which enclose the toes must be worn in workshops, laboratories and practical rooms.
- Clothing should not include anything related to alcohol, drugs or have offensive images or text.

Where the College Management considers dress to be unsuitable, they reserve the right to send students home to change.

APPEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Hair: Students are able to have the range of natural hair colours, including streaks. No extreme bright colours, or colour combinations e.g. pink, purple, green hair or extreme hairstyles (skinheads etc).
- Facial hair: It is up to families to determine what is right for them around student facial hair. We expect any facial hair to be tidily groomed. Students representing the school in a formal capacity may be asked to be clean shaven for particular events.
- Make Up: Students can wear discrete natural makeup
- Facial piercings: students are able to have a single side nose piercing. No other facial piercings including lips, eyebrows, nose (other than described above)
- Earrings: students can wear studs or small sleepers. Students may have more than one piercing. Looped earrings or dangling earrings that could get caught or pose a health and safety risk for students are not permitted.
- Necklaces: Students may wear a necklace or taonga. They should not be dangling outside their clothing during activities or classes where they can get caught and cause a health and safety hazard.
